
We hate making mistakes, particularly when they lead to *you* making a mistake.

We scrupulously edit all our patterns, but when an inaccuracy does slip through we post a correction as quickly as possible.


Corrections for this book have been compiled in this PDF. If we're aware of an error, we fix it before reprinting a book, so your edition may already include these changes.

4. Sew dark green $3\frac{1}{4}$ " triangles, off-white $3\frac{1}{4}$ " triangles, and off-white $2\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles together in rows as shown. Make two of each row.




5. Sew the shorter rows from step 4 to opposite sides of the unit from step 3; press. Sew the longer rows from step 4 to the remaining sides; press.




6. Sew a large violet triangle to each side of the light green floral $4\frac{7}{8}$ " triangle; press. Make four units.




7. Sew dark green $3\frac{1}{4}$ " triangles, off-white $3\frac{1}{4}$ " triangles, and off-white $2\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles together in rows as shown. Make four of each.




8. Sew one of each short row from step 7 to opposite sides of the units from step 6; press. Add a long row from step 7 to one remaining side as shown; press. Make 4 units.




9. Sew a light green floral $4\frac{7}{8}$ " triangle and two light green floral $5\frac{1}{4}$ " triangles to two units from step 8 as shown. Press seam allowances toward the light green floral triangles. Sew a light green floral $4\frac{7}{8}$ " triangle to the remaining two units from step 8.



10. Sew one violet $1\frac{7}{8}$ " triangle and three off-white $1\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles together as shown. Add a dark green $2\frac{7}{8}$ " triangle and press. Make 12 units.



11. Sew two violet $1\frac{1}{8}$ " triangles, two off-white $1\frac{1}{8}$ " triangles, and two off-white $3\frac{1}{4}$ " triangles together as shown; press. Sew a dark green $2\frac{7}{8}$ " triangle to each side; press.





12. Sew the units from steps 10 and 11 together as shown. Make two rows.



13. Arrange and sew the units from step 9 and the center unit in diagonal rows; press. Sew the rows together.



14. Add the units from step 12 to the top and bottom of the quilt.



15. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Add the binding and enjoy.

 Finished appliquéd block: 8" x 12"

Materials

- 1 fat quarter of cream print for appliqué background
- 3 fat eighths *total* of assorted pink prints for blocks and appliqués
- 3 fat eighths *total* of assorted brown prints for blocks and appliqués
- 1 fat quarter *total* of assorted cream prints for blocks
- 1 fat quarter of fabric for binding
- 1 fat quarter of fabric for backing
- 18" x 22" piece of batting

Cutting

From the fat quarter of cream print, cut:
 1 rectangle, 9" x 13"

From the assorted brown prints, cut:
 14 squares, 3¼" x 3¼"; cut twice diagonally to make 56 triangles
 28 squares, 1⅞" x 1⅞"; cut once diagonally to make 56 triangles*

From the assorted cream prints, cut:
 56 squares, 1⅞" x 1⅞"; cut once diagonally to make 112 triangles*

From the assorted pink prints, cut:
 14 squares, 3¼" x 3¼"; cut twice diagonally to make 56 triangles
 28 squares, 1⅞" x 1⅞"; cut once diagonally to make 56 triangles*


From the binding fabric, cut:

4 strips, 1¾" x 20"

*Cut in matching pairs for Pinwheel blocks with coordinating fabrics.

Appliquing the Center Block


1. Referring to “Needle-Turn Hand Appliqué” on page 90, cut and prepare the appliqué pieces using the patterns on page 63. Enlarge the pattern 125%. Cut the stems on the bias, adding a ⅜" seam allowance for hand appliqué.
2. Fold and lightly press the cream 9" x 13" background rectangle in fourths.
3. Align the dashed lines on the appliqué pattern with the creases in the background fabric. Mark the appliqué pattern on the background fabric.
4. Arrange the appliqué pieces on the background; pin and appliqué them in place using your favorite method.



5. Press the appliquéd quilt center from the wrong side and trim to 8½" x 12½", centering the design.

Piecing the Border Blocks

1. Select four matching pink 1⅞" triangles and four matching cream 1⅞" triangles for each Pinwheel block. Sew a pink and a cream triangle together to make a half-square-triangle unit. Make four. Sew the units together in rows, and then sew the rows together to make the Pinwheel blocks. Make 14 pink-and-cream Pinwheel blocks. The blocks should measure 2½" x 2½".



Make 14.
