




We goofed.

5. Sew a striped triangle from step 1 to a unit from step 4 as shown. Repeat to make a total of eight units.





6. Sew a green 3" half-square triangle to a black 3" half-square triangle. Press. Repeat to make a total of eight half-square-triangle units. Trim each unit to 2½" x 2½".





7. Sew a half-square-triangle unit from step 6 to a black 2½" square as shown. Make eight.





8. Sew a unit from step 5 to a unit from step 7 as shown. Repeat to make a total of eight flower units.





9. Partially sew an accent square to a flower unit from step 8, sewing only half of the seam as indicated by the dotted line. Leave the second half of the seam unstitched for now.

10. Sew a second flower unit to the left side of the unit from step 9. In the same fashion, sew a third and then a fourth flower unit in place, building on the previous unit as shown. As the final step, finish sewing the unstitched portion of the first seam.




11. Repeat steps 9 and 10 to make a second block.
12. Repeat steps 1–11 with the remaining block sets to make a total of 14 blocks. You'll have one extra block when you assemble the quilt, unless you followed the cutting instructions on pages 37 and 39 to make one less block from the seventh set.

QUILT-TOP ASSEMBLY

1. Refer to "Folded Corners" on page 7 to draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each green 2½" sashing square. Sew marked squares to opposite corners of a black solid 4½" square as shown. Trim ¼" from the stitching line and press the seam allowances toward the green corners. Repeat for the

remaining corners to make a sashing square. Make a total of 12 sashing squares.

2. Refer to the quilt assembly diagram below to lay out 13 blocks, the 12 sashing squares, the assorted black print $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing strips, the green large and small side setting triangles, and the green corner setting triangles in diagonal rows as shown. Sew the

units in each row together. Join the rows. Add the corner setting triangles last. Trim the quilt top to $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the sashing corner points.

3. Sew the black solid $2\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide strips together end to end to make one long strip. From this pieced strip, measure and cut two strips to fit the center length of the quilt top. Sew these strips to the sides of the quilt top. From the remainder of the pieced strip, measure and cut two strips to fit the center width of the quilt top. Sew these strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

FINISHING

1. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste the layers together.
2. Quilt as desired.
3. Bind the quilt edges with the $2\frac{1}{4}$ "-wide binding strips.
