




## **We goofed.**

The corrections listed here should allow you to complete your project with ease. If not, give us a call at 800-426-3126 and we'll do our best to help. And again, many apologies for the error.


seams. Sew along this line and then trim  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the stitching line. Repeat for the other corner.




the bag right side out through the opening in the lining. Slip-stitch the opening closed. Push the lining into the bag, smooth it out, and then press. Edgestitch  $\frac{1}{8}$ " from the top edge.

## Finishing the Bag

Cut the cord in half to make two equal lengths. Thread one of the lengths through one casing and around and through the other. Tie the cord ends in a knot. Repeat for the remaining length, starting at the opposite side of the bag. Pull the cords to close the bag.



4. Pin the lining rectangles right sides together. Using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance, sew down one long side and across the bottom, leaving a 3" opening for turning, and up the other long side. Leave the top open. Box the corners of the lining as you did for the bag. Do not turn the lining right side out.
5. Place the outer bag inside the lining, right sides together and matching the side seams. Pin along the top raw edge. Sew around the top edge. Turn

Cinnamon Delights Bag

¼" twice and topstitch to hem. Fold the strip in half lengthwise, *wrong* sides together, and press. Aligning the raw edges, stitch the folded strip to the top of the wall-hanging back, ⅛" from the raw edges.

4. Using the blue 1½" x 42" strips, make and attach the binding using the single-fold method *before* completing the quilting ¼" from the binding seam (do not quilt through the sleeve, if there is one). Stitch the lower (folded) edge of the sleeve to the backing by hand.




**Little Blue House

1½" x 8½" strip to the right side of the rectangle. Press the seam allowances toward the strips. Add the red 1½" x 7½" strips to the top and bottom to complete the pieced rectangle for the front of the folder. Press the seam allowances toward the strips. With right sides together, sew the purple 7½" x 10½" rectangle to the left edge of the folder front to make the back of the folder. Press the seam allowances toward the purple fabric to complete the folder cover.




## Quilting the Folder Cover

Layer the cover and the batting. Use the pearl cotton and big-stitch quilting (see page 10) to quilt a wavy frame around the embroidery, a wavy line in the center of the blue strip, and three equally spaced, parallel wavy lines down the back. Quilt ¼" from the seam in the green, purple, and red strips. Trim the batting even with the fabric.


## Making the Folder Pockets

1. To make the folder pockets, fold the blue 6½" x 14" rectangle in half, wrong sides together, to make a 6½" x 7" folded rectangle. Press, and then topstitch along the fold. Fold the purple 6½" x 10" rectangle in half, wrong sides together, to make a 5" x 6½" folded rectangle. Press, and then topstitch along the fold.


2. Aligning raw edges at the sides and bottom, layer the purple pocket on the blue pocket. Place the layered pockets on a green 6½" x 10½" rectangle, right side up, with side and bottom edges aligned. Baste the pockets in place, ⅛" from the raw edges.



3. Place the second green rectangle right side down on the first, aligning raw edges. Stitch the rectangles together on the right edge.



4. Fold the second green rectangle to the back, press, and then topstitch along the fold to complete the pocket rectangle.



5. Place the pocket rectangle, pocket side up, on the left side of the purple 10½" x 14½" lining rectangle, right side up. Align raw edges at the
