

## MAKING THE HALF-SQUARE-TRIANGLE UNITS

Using this method, you'll make two identical half-square-triangle units at a time.


- 1 Place a blue  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square and a brown  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square right sides together.
- 2 Mark a diagonal line on the back of one of the squares. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, open, and press the seam allowances toward the brown fabric. Trim to  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Make 256 blue-and-brown half-square-triangle units.



## MAKING THE JACOB'S LADDER BLOCKS


This quilt is made up of traditional Jacob's Ladder blocks in four color variations.

- 1 Arrange four half-square-triangle units and five four-patch units in brown and blue or aqua in three rows as shown. Sew the rows together and press the seam allowances toward the four-patch units. The block should measure  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make 16 blocks in this color arrangement.




- 2 Repeat step 1 to arrange and sew units in the color arrangements as shown. Make 16 of each block.

## ASSEMBLING THE QUILT

- 1 Referring to the quilt assembly diagram on page 72, lay out the blocks in eight rows of eight blocks each. Rotate the blocks as shown to create the brown, blue or aqua, and bright diagonal chains. Sew the blocks into rows, and press seam allowances in opposite directions from row to row. Join the rows and press seam allowances in one direction to complete the quilt center.
- 2 Sew two bright-pink  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips together end to end and trim to measure  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $72\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make two inner borders.
- 3 Sew the pink inner borders to the top and bottom of quilt center. Press the seam allowances toward the inner-border strips.
