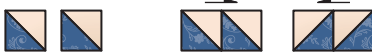
## MAKING THE BEAR PAW BLOCKS

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of a beige  $2\frac{1}{8}$ " square. With right sides together, lay the marked  $2\frac{1}{8}$ " square on a blue  $2\frac{1}{8}$ " square. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line to make two half-square-triangle units. Press the seam allowances toward the blue triangles. Repeat to make a total of 512 half-square-triangle units.



Make 512.

2. With right sides together, sew two half-square-triangle units in pairs; note the position of the blue triangles. Press the seam allowances toward the blue triangles. Repeat to make a total of 256 pairs, 128 facing in each direction.



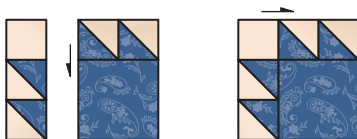
Make 128 of each.

3. Sew a beige  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " square to the blue right edge of a pair of units from step 2 to make a blue segment. Press the seam allowances toward the beige square. Repeat to make 128 blue segments.



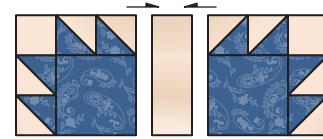
Make 128.

4. Sew a blue  $3$ " square to a unit from step 2. Press the seam allowances toward the blue square. Sew a blue segment from step 3 to an adjacent edge of the blue square as shown to make a bear paw unit. Press the seam allowances toward the blue square. Repeat to make a total of 128 bear paw units.



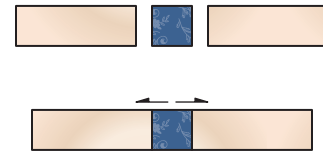
Make 128.

5. Sew together two bear paw units and one beige  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{4}$ " rectangle along the long edges to make a bear paw strip. Press the seam allowances toward the beige rectangle. Repeat to make a total of 64 bear paw strips.



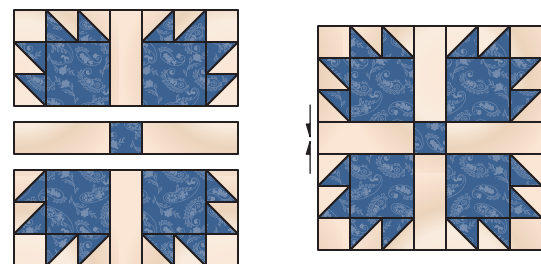
Make 64.

6. Sew together one blue  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " square and two beige  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{4}$ " rectangles along the short edges to make a center strip. Press the seam allowances toward the beige strips. Repeat to make a total of 32 center strips.



Make 32.

7. Sew together two bear paw strips and one center strip in three rows to make a Bear Paw block. Press the seam allowances toward the center strip. Repeat to make total of 32 Bear Paw blocks.



Make 32.
