


2 Fuse the fleece to the wrong side of one red-print square. Trace around the paper template onto the right side of the red-print square. Cut out the circle along the drawn line.

3 Trace and cut a second circle from the red print for the back of the tree skirt. Set this circle aside for now.

4 Use the circle pattern on page 29 to trace a small circle in the center of the large fabric circle. Cut from the outer edge of the large circle to the center of the circle, then cut out the small circle.



5 Make a tongue template from template plastic or cardboard using the pattern on pattern sheet 1. Fold the remaining red print in half with right sides together. Trace 24 tongues onto the wrong side of the fabric, leaving space between them for seam allowances. Sew on the drawn line of the tongues using a small machine stitch, leaving the straight edge open.



6 Cut the tongues apart and turn them right side out. Slide the template inside each tongue and press the tongue flat.

7 Make a plastic or cardboard template of the circle on the tongue pattern. Trace the circle onto scrap appliqué fabrics, cutting approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ " outside the marked circles for seam allowance. I made 15 print circles and 9 tan solid circles that I embroidered. For embroidery circles, use any of the "Countdown to Christmas" designs on pattern sheet 2. Use two strands of floss and a backstitch to complete the embroidery. Position each circle on a tongue, referring to the pattern for placement. Turn under the edges and stitch in place.

8 Arrange the tongues around the outside of the tree skirt circle, face down and evenly spaced, with raw edges even with the edge of the circle. Pin and baste the tongues in place.
