What You'll Need

A: 2 light print squares, $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$

B: 8 light print rectangles,
 $1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 2\frac{3}{4}''$

C: 2 teal print squares, $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$

D: 4 red print squares, $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$

E: 1 red print square, $2'' \times 2''$

F: 4 gold print F shapes using the pattern on page 21

Assembly

Press all seam allowances in the directions indicated by the arrows.



1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the A and D squares.

2. Referring to "Triangle Squares" on page 135, place an A square on a C square with right sides together. Sew, cut, and press to make two half-square-triangle units. Trim the units to $2\frac{3}{4}''$ square. Make four.





3. Referring to "Stitch and Flip" on page 136, place a D square on the C corner of a half-square-triangle unit. Sew, trim, and press. Make four.

4. Fold an F piece in half lengthwise, wrong sides together. Place the folded F piece on the right side of a B rectangle, aligning the edges as shown. Place a second B rectangle on top, right sides together. Sew through all layers using a $\frac{1}{4}''$ seam allowance. Make four units.
