

Making the Blocks

Join two light and two pink or red $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares as shown to make a Four Patch block. Press the seam allowances as indicated by the arrows. Make 12 blocks.

The blocks should measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square.




Assembling the Quilt Top

After sewing each seam, press the seam allowances as indicated by the arrows.


1. Sew four blocks, six light $4\frac{1}{8}$ " side triangles, and four light $2\frac{3}{8}$ " corner triangles together in a vertical row as shown. Trim and square up the row, making sure to leave $\frac{1}{4}$ " beyond the points of all the blocks for the seam allowances. Make three rows. The rows should measure approximately $3\frac{3}{8}$ " \times $11\frac{7}{8}$ ".



2. Sew the vertical rows and floral $1\frac{5}{8}$ "-wide strips together. The quilt should measure $11\frac{1}{4}$ " \times $11\frac{7}{8}$ ".



3. Sew light pink $2\frac{1}{4}$ " \times $11\frac{7}{8}$ " strips to opposite sides of the quilt. Sew a light $2\frac{1}{4}$ " square to each end of a light pink $2\frac{1}{4}$ " \times $11\frac{1}{4}$ " strip. Make two and sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Finishing the Quilt

1. For free, downloadable help with the following steps, go to ShopMartingale.com/HowtoQuilt. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing; baste the layers together.
2. Using cream hand-quilting thread, quilt in the ditch around the center of the quilt. Quilt an X in each block and along the inside of the vertical rows. Mark and then quilt a single wavy line along the floral print strips and a double wavy line in the borders. (I used a stencil to mark my lines.) With a washable fabric marker, draw a heart shape in the corner blocks. Using red thread, stitch on the drawn line to outline the hearts.
3. Attach the binding to the quilt, referring to "Single-Fold Binding" on page 78.
