# Silly Row



**FINISHED ROW: 4" × 48"**

## Materials

*Yardage is based on 42"-wide fabric. Fat quarters are 18" × 21".*

10" × 10" square each of 12 assorted light fabrics (or  $\frac{3}{8}$  yard)

5" × 5" square each of 12 assorted medium fabrics (or 1 fat quarter)

5" × 5" square each of 12 assorted dark fabrics (or  $\frac{1}{3}$  yard)

## Cutting

*All measurements include  $\frac{1}{4}$ "-wide seam allowances.*

**From each of the 12 light fabrics, cut:**

4 rectangles, 1" × 2½" (48 total)

4 squares, 2" × 2" (48 total)

4 rectangles, 1" × 2" (48 total)

**From each of the 12 dark fabrics, cut:**


4 squares, 2" × 2" (48 total)

**From each of the 12 medium fabrics, cut:**

4 squares, 2" × 2" (48 total)


## Make the Blocks

**1** Join a dark square and a light 1" × 2" rectangle as shown. Sew a light 1" × 2½" rectangle to the bottom of the unit. Repeat to make a total of four matching units.




Make 4 units,  
2½" × 2½".

**2** Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each light 2" square from the same light print used in step 1. Layer a marked light square on a unit from step 1, right sides together. Stitch on the marked line. Trim  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the stitching line. Repeat with all units from step 1.




Make 4 units,  
2½" × 2½".

**3** Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of four matching medium 2½" squares. Layer a marked medium square on a unit from step 2, right sides together. Stitch on the marked line. Trim  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the stitching line. Repeat with all units from step 2.



Make 4 units,  
2½" × 2½".

**4** Lay out the units from step 3 in two rows of two as shown. Join the units in each row. Join the rows to make a block. The block should measure 4½" square.



Make 1 block,  
4½" × 4½".

**5** Repeat steps 1-4 to make a total of 12 blocks.

## Assemble the Row

Lay out the blocks side by side in one horizontal row. Join the blocks and press the seam allowances open. The completed row should measure 4½" × 48½", including seam allowances.
