Materials

Yardage is based on 42"-wide fabric.

30 strips, 2½" x 42", of assorted dark prints for braid pieces

27 strips, 2½" x 42", of assorted light prints for braid pieces

½ yard of yellow print for setting triangles

⅝ yard of red print for binding

4 yards of fabric for backing

61" x 68" piece of batting

All-in-One Ruler by That Patchwork Place or template plastic

Cutting

Refer to "Special Cutting" at right before you begin.

From each of the 30 dark print strips, cut:

6 rectangles, 2½" x 6½" (180 total; 4 are extra)

From each of the 27 light print strips, cut:

6 rectangles, 2½" x 6½" (162 total; 2 are extra)

From the yellow print, cut:

2 squares, 9¾" x 9¾"; cut into quarters diagonally to yield 8 quarter-square triangles

4 squares, 3¾" x 3¾"; cut in half diagonally to yield 8 half-square triangles

1 strip, 5⅛" x 42"; crosscut into 4 squares, 5⅛" x 5⅛".
Cut the squares in half diagonally to yield 8 half-square triangles.

From the red print, cut:

7 binding strips, 2½" x 42"



Cutting from Scraps

If you prefer to use scraps, follow the instructions below. See "Cutting" above for instructions on cutting the setting triangles and binding. To cut the angled pieces for the braid, see "Special Cutting" at right; disregard step 1 of either option if you are not cutting the rectangles from strips.

From assorted dark prints, cut:

176 rectangles, 2½" x 6½"

From assorted light prints, cut:

160 rectangles, 2½" x 6½"

Special Cutting

There are two options for cutting the angled pieces that will create the braid units. Option 1 requires the All-in-One Ruler. Option 2 requires that you make a template from template plastic.

Option 1

- 1 Fold each of the 2½" x 42" strips in half, wrong sides together. From each strip, cut a total of six rectangles, 2½" x 6½" (three cuts, two layers).
- 2 Keep the pairs of rectangles wrong sides together. Place the bottom of the All-in-One Ruler along the long edge of the rectangle, and the narrow, pointed edge of the ruler on the right edge of the rectangle as shown.



- 3 Trim the rectangles around the 45° edges of the ruler as shown. You will have two mirror-image braid pieces.



Option 2

- 1 Follow step 1 of option 1 above to cut the 2½" x 6½" rectangles.
- 2 Make a template by tracing the pattern for the cutting guide on page 26 onto template plastic. Cut the template out on the traced lines using scissors.
- 3 Keep the pairs of rectangles wrong sides together and place the template on the top of the rectangles. Trim the rectangles by placing the edge of a rotary-cutting ruler along the 45° angles of the template. You will have two mirror-image braid pieces.
